Known for their farm-to-table restaurants, Epiphany Farms Enterprises utilizes sustainable, organic, environmentally friendly farming techniques. Following lunch, we will receive a behind the scenes curtain tour of the Bloomington Center for the Performing Arts. The Center offers dance, musical, and theatre performances throughout the year. Visitors will have a chance to view the neo-Classical design and learn about the Center's history. We then head to Ewing Cultural Center for a tour of Ewing Manor, Bloomington's only castle. We end the day with a tour of The Chocolatier to watch chocolate

Delavan / Lincoln



Begin the day with breakfast or lunch at the Harvest Café. Located in historic downtown Delavan, the Harvest Café specializes in a farmto-table restaurant experience using meats and produce from area farms. We will then travel to Lincoln, Illinois and visit the

Lincoln Heritage Museum, located on the campus of Lincoln College. Through audio-videos, attractive graphics, and realistic 19th-century room recreations, the visitor is drawn into Lincoln's life through a "life review" of his experiences and memories. The visitor is encouraged to touch objects as they light up to view video and still images and hear voices from the past narrate the scenes using authentic first-person accounts. The tour is self-guided and lasts approximately one hour and 15 minutes. From there, we will travel to a replica of the Postville Courthouse. Built in 1953, the building is a close replica of the 1840 courthouse used by lawyer Abraham Lincoln. This tour will be about 25 minutes. Before leaving Lincoln, we will stop at the Railsplitter Covered Wagon. The Guinness Book of World Records lists the wagon as the largest in the world! Quincy



The first tour stop will be a visit to Underbrink's Bakery, in business since 1929, creating made-fromscratch baked good. We will learn about Claude Underbrink opening the shop and see the original display cases, antique ovens, and baking tools from the 1930s. A fabulous sweet tray with bakery samples will also be provided. From there, we will take a selfguided tour through St. Francis Church adorned with interior murals and white marble. The church opened in 1884 and has a Gothic Revival style. Afterwards, it is time for lunch at Tiramisu, in downtown Quincy, featuring Italian cuisine. Following lunch, we visit two historic homes on Maine Street for tours. A stop at the Villa Kathrine completes the day. Built in 1900, The Villa was a residence modeled to look like a castle. It now houses the Quincy Area Convention & Visitors Bureau. Cost includes transportation and entrance to activities. Lunch and shopping expenses are at your own cost. 




