About the Educator Professional Development Program...

The University of Wisconsin-Parkside supports educators through:

- Credit and Non-credit Courses
- Professional Development Plans (PDP)
- License Renewal Support
- Customized Training
- Lending Library (Video, Books, and Resources)

Credit and Non-credit Courses

We provide credit and non-credit programming for initial, professional, and master level educators; administrators; and pupil services personnel, while aligning all programming with state and Common Core Standards for educator development and license renewal.

PDP (Professional Development Plan) Assistance

The Writing Your PDP Workshop guides initial educators through the process of preparing their Professional Development Plan (PDP) required to obtain their Professional Educator license. Participants will develop an understanding of PI-34 requirements, reflect on their first year of teaching, and learn the composition of a Professional Development Plan. Additionally, initial educators will engage in activities in order to create their plan and then get their goal approved by a Professional Development Plan Team.

License Renewal Support Center

We are one of fourteen License Renewal Support Centers (LRSC) in the state. Supported with funds from the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction, our LRSC provides the following services:

- Assistance in creation of a professional development plan (PDP).
- Assistance in creation of your PDP review team.
- Training of mentors.
- Facilitation of ongoing orientation and support seminars based on the Wisconsin standards for initial educators.
- Training (with assistance of DPI) cohorts of professional educators in the teacher, administrator, and pupil service categories to serve on professional development teams.

Customized Training

Learning Structures

The PEARL Personalized Learning Institute is a partnership between Kenosha Unified School District and the University of Wisconsin-Parkside and is open to all educators seeking to develop their skills. One, two, and three day session options are available in full day and half day formats. PEARL Institute courses will focus on the following session strands:

- Assessment** Build knowledge and skills based on different forms of assessment and learn how to utilize assessment to guide instruction.
- Flexible Learning Structures** Determine a variety of different learning structures to be used in the classroom to meet student needs through collaboration, creativity, critical thinking and communication.
- Proficiency-Based Learning** Focus on rigorous learning goals while creating flexible learning paths for students.
- College/Career Readiness** Create a college-going culture in classrooms by exposing students to career exploration through collaboration and rigorous learning experiences.
- Educator Roles and Capacity** Define roles as coach/advisor in the classroom through strategies and techniques that strengthen teams and redefine their role in student achievement.
- Engagement** Engage students in their own learning by creating experiences that express student choice and voice.

Participant Fee Structure:

- \$25.00 per session per participant per day for either a morning OR afternoon session
- \$40.00 per participant per day for either morning AND afternoon session or full day session
- \$100.00 per team of three per day for either morning AND afternoon session or full day

Credit Fees: 1 or 2 credits are available

- \$175.00 for undergraduate credit (session fee included in this charge)
- \$280.00 for graduate credit (additional course work to earn graduate credit)

Flipping the Classroom with FIZZ

Presented by Dr. Lodge McCammon



Dr. Lodge McCammon, a curriculum and contemporary media specialist, from the Friday Institute at North Carolina State University, will be joined by a lead teacher to explore how flipped learning works in the public school classroom. Dr. McCammon's program, FIZZ, encourages teachers to have 'No lecture in the classroom.'

FIZZ, fi.ncsu.edu/fizz, is a new, innovative approach to teaching that takes the traditional lecture out of the class, and opens instruction time for collaborative and engaging student learning activities. The goal is to find new ways to teach standards-based lessons with differentiated instruction so all types of learners have the chance to attain academic success. Lectures are delivered by the teacher through videos so the students can utilize class time to the fullest, with varied activities that allow for higher-level instruction, understanding and application.

Early Childhood Classroom Environment

This course is for staff (teachers, educational assistants, and therapists) who work with children ages 3-6. In this course participants will:

1. Discuss how to use room arrangement as a teaching strategy as well as strategies to create positive and supportive environments for children.
2. Discuss setting up and maintaining the classroom.
3. Discuss establishing a structure for each day.
4. Learn how to create a classroom community.
5. Learn how to facilitate promoting positive social emotional skills for young children.

Mean Girls or Just Misguided: A Look into the World of Social Bullying

Instructor: Jamie Kupkovits

Dates: 7/9/2012 – 8/9/2012

Location: Online

Credit: 1 credit

It's just how girls are! It's just what girls do!" You've heard the phrases and seen the popular movies that often depict girls as being mean and socially catty. Spreading gossip, excluding and isolating others are just a few of the behaviors often depicted as being characteristic of "girl behavior".

This course will examine these behaviors, often referred to as relational aggression, by taking a closer look at why they occur and what educators and parents can do to prevent and intervene when they happen. This course will also focus on how girls can form healthy relationships.

Topics include:

1. Understanding and dealing with feelings.
2. Understanding the importance of a healthy self-esteem and sense of worth.
3. Learning about the influence of our belief systems.
4. Examining the importance of empathy and perspective taking in understanding differences.
5. Identifying and addressing social bullying and promoting healthy relationships.

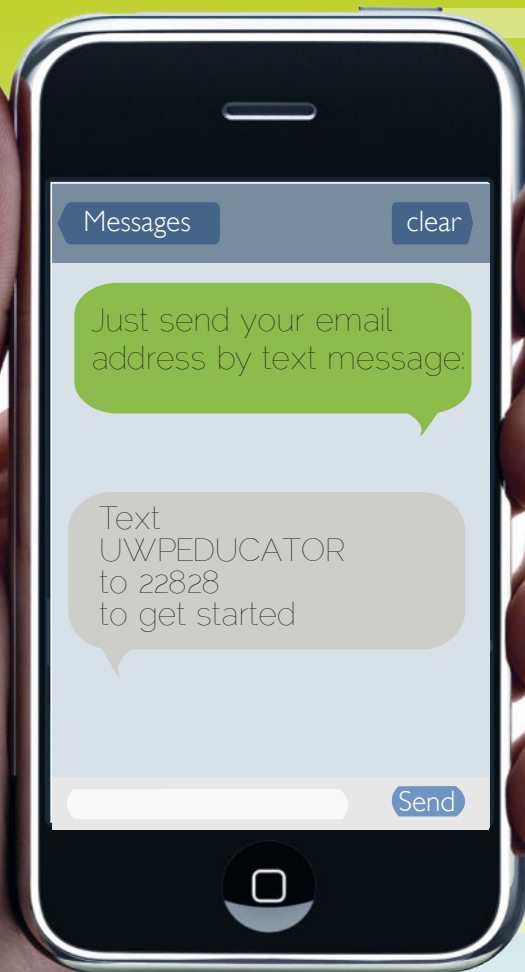

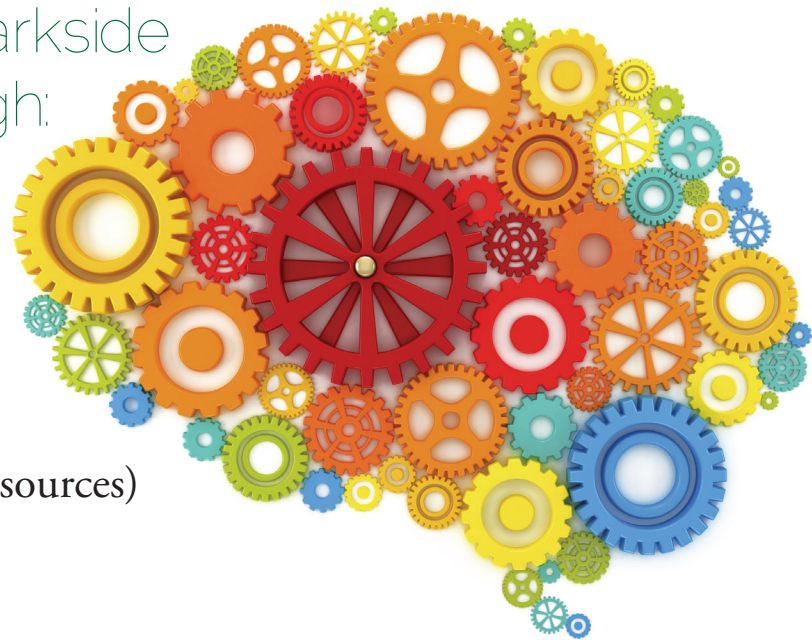
