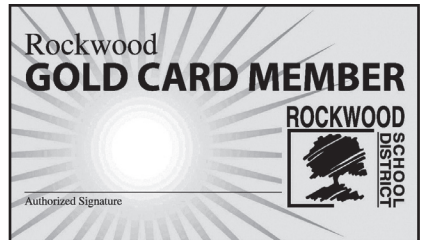

Before and After School

The Before and After School Program which is available at all elementary schools is designed to provide children K–5 with a safe, well-supervised and fun environment. The daily schedule includes a variety of indoor and outdoor activities, snack, and homework help.

SwimAmerica is a state-of-the-art, learn to swim program developed by the American Swim Coaches Association that is goal driven and technique oriented. All instructors are trained and certified by the SwimAmerica site supervisors.

SwimAmerica is taught in ten stations:

Station 1: Bubbles

Station 5: Freestyle

Station 8: Butterfly

Station 2: Floats & Glides

Station 6: Backstroke

Station 9: Lifetime Strokes

Station 3: Kicking

Station 7: Breaststroke

Station 10: Individual Medley

Station 4: Crawl Stroke

SwimAmerica teaches more than just how to swim. Proper techniques are emphasized, with attention given to correct body position, movement of arms and legs, breathing and timing of the strokes. In all stations, the students will focus on safety, fitness, health and fun.

Each new student will be evaluated and placed in the station that best suits their ability. A returning student will be placed in the station they were working on at the end of the last session. The site supervisor will track each student's progress and station placement. Please remember that all students learn at a different rate.

After station ten of the SwimAmerica program, the student will be able to swim 300 yards of freestyle and be proficient in all four Olympic Strokes: butterfly, backstroke, breaststroke and freestyle. They will also have the skills necessary to join the Rockwood Swim Club, one of the premier USA swim teams in the country.

Registration Policy: There is a high demand for SwimAmerica classes, so early enrollment is encouraged. Classes are filled on a first-come first-served basis. We reserve the right to limit enrollment.

Refund Policy: A \$3 processing fee will be charged for all refunds. You must call and cancel at least five business days prior to the start of class to receive a refund. Refunds will be given at the end of the session if a class is cancelled. **There will be no make-ups if you are unable to attend a class.**

Adult Beginner Swim Lessons

This class is for the true beginner ages 19 and up. Taught in a small group setting, you will learn to float, kick, swim and be safe in the water. More advanced swimmers can attend the adult masters program. SwimAmerica reserves the right to cancel due to low enrollment.

Parent/Child & Preschool Programs

The Parent/Child swim classes are designed to have parents in the pool with their child ages two and younger where the child will learn through the use of songs and games. The Preschool program is designed to teach 3–5 year olds to be comfortable in a school age program setting. Proper breathing, front/back float, and kicking techniques will be taught.

The Rockwood Swim Club is a nationally recognized swim club that offers swim groups depending on age and ability. You need to be able to swim at least 300 yards and a legal 100 individual medley.

All new swimmers need to tryout. Please call the Swim Club office [636-891-6635](tel:636-891-6635) to arrange a time to tryout.

Rockwood Swim Club Fees:

Bronze Group (ages 6–11): \$95 per month

Silver Group (ages 8–12): \$105 per month

Senior Prep Group (ages 11 & up) \$105 per month

Gold Group (ages 10–13): \$115 per month

Senior Group (ages 13 & up): \$130 per month

National Prep (ages 13 & up): \$145 per month

National Group (ages 13 & up): \$160 per month



A USA membership fee of \$53 plus administration and program enhancement fees are required once per year for all of the Rockwood Swim Club groups. Fees for swim meets are additional and are the responsibility of the swimmer.

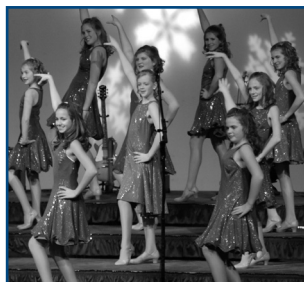

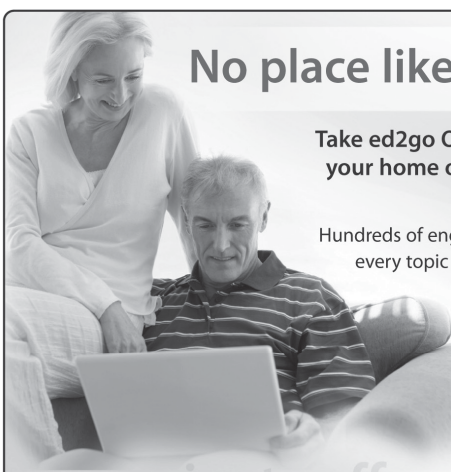
